SUPPLIES:
All art materials and project supplies are supplied by the teacher –
Students need to bring a pencil to class **daily**.

Students will be watching a variety of art related films to supplement the classroom learning experience.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Art 7 is a basic skills class, designed for all students who wish to take art. This course is grounded in the Elements of Art and Principles of Design and the class assignments and projects will reflect these concepts. Some rudimentary drawing skills will be taught to enhance the curriculum. All of the project-based assignments will be done in-class.

COURSE EXPECTATIONS:

Students are required to observe all school rules and regulations as stated in the student handbook and the school wide policy. The students are to come to class on time, prepared to work and observe the right of others to do the same. Since it is important to maintain a proper room environment, students will not be dismissed by the bell but by the teacher when it is apparent that all is in order.

Make up assignments are done on a case-by-case basis due to the difficulty of working on art projects at home. Some alternative make up assignments will be available at the discretion of the teacher.

EVALUATION:

Grading will be assessed on a point system. The total project points earned at the end of the semester will be combined with scores from any written work and tests, weekly participation, attendance, and citizenship to arrive at a final grade. Student work is not so much graded on talent, but on the individual student's progress and daily effort. **UNEXCUSED ABSENCES, LACK OF DAILY PARTICIPATION ON SUSTAINED PROJECTS, AND INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR WILL BE REFLECTED IN THE POINTS EARNED TOWARD A FINAL GRADE.**
